## **1 THE ORGANIZATION**

### **1.1 Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service**

Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service was established on April 08, 2006 under the Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service (Constitution, Functions and Powers) Act, 2006. The first Prosecutor General was appointed on 11.02.2006.

#### **1.1.1 Slogan:**

“Quest For Justice.”

#### **1.1.2 Vision:**

Scoring a line of distinction to raise the emblem high in the regime of criminal justice system, for a service that is to be recognized for its independence and courage to prosecute fairly the offenders from all walks of life without fear and favour.

#### **1.1.3 Mission:**

Follow all legal course in discipline to help the people unfairly entangled in criminal litigation, counter the malice, support the oppressed victims and assist the courts with unequivocal prosecutorial say so as to make the criminal justice system a source of relief and solace for all.

#### **1.1.4 Virtual Clicks:**

Prosecution service is striving hard to set precedents in the system of a service that is helpful to all with following virtues.

#### **1.1.5 Gate Keeper:**

Frivolous litigation is neutralized through effective scrutiny of cases in order to bring real offenders to justice.

#### **1.1.6 Promoting Cooperation:**

All stake holders in criminal justice system need a humble approach in fair dealing of issues to lead the criminal processes in ease, and it is the quality that service maintains at all cost.

**1.1.7 Upholding The Law High:**

All laws and judicial precedents help the needy to seek justice from courts on approved terms; prosecutors being abreast of knowledge defy every effort to deviate from these standards.

**1.1.8 Assimilation of Executive Say:**

Government being a policy maker always needs supporters to formalize its vision for betterment of general public; prosecutors take this responsibility by putting it before the forums responsible for effective implementation.

**1.1.9 Check And Balance:**

This value steps into the service, to ensure the efficiency in performance of functions, preventing corruption and other vices, cleansing the miscellaneous and raising the level of service high.

**1.1.10 Mandate:**

The mandate of the Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service (PCPS) is set out in the Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service Act 2006. The Act calls on the PCPS to establish an independent, effective and efficient Service for prosecution of criminal cases, to ensure prosecutorial independence and for better co-ordination in the Criminal Justice System of the Province.

**1.2 Eyes in Focus:**

Prevailing prosecution laws are scanty, they do not cater to the requirement of independent and effective prosecution; need for amendment in Cr.P.C. is very high and requisite as the time demands; draft has already been shared with the interior ministry; hope doable be done soon.

Amendment in Cr.P.C. for discharge of accused u/s 265-D & Prosecution Act for gate keeping powers are another milestone, to be achieved in order to take the prosecution out of clutches for performing impartially and taking prosecutorial decisions undependably.

Extensive trainings and mentoring on capacity building of prosecutors to cultivate excellence in scrutinizing the cases effectively and

taking corrective measures.

Need for developing SOPs for Medico-Legal officers and coordination among the stake holders to cover a large area of criminal litigation which has direct impact on socio economic activity of the country.

Division of labour, a concept that produce expertise and excellence in work performance; therefore, a vision to introduce a mechanism for specialization of prosecutors in different categories of crime is underway.

## **2 OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL PUNJAB:**

### **2.1 Functions**

Prosecutor General is the head of the Prosecution Service. The Prosecution Service has the following functions:

- The Prosecutor General shall have a right of representation and audience on behalf of the Government in all courts including the Supreme Court, the Federal Shariat Court and the High Court.
- The Prosecutor General or if so authorized by him, an Additional Prosecutor General shall distribute work to the Prosecutors in the Supreme Court, the High Court, the Federal Shariat Court or a Special Court established under any law for the time being in force.
- The Prosecutor General shall submit an annual report of the Service to the Government within three months of the conclusion of the calendar year to which the report pertains:

Provided that the Government shall lay the report before the Provincial Assembly within two months of its receipt; and keep

the Government informed about the performance of the Service.

- The Prosecutor General may issue general guidelines to the Prosecutors or officers responsible for investigation for effective and efficient prosecution.
- The Prosecutor General or the District Public Prosecutor may, refer to the authority, competent to initiate disciplinary proceedings under any law for the time being in force, to take disciplinary action against any public servant working in connection with investigation or prosecution, for any act committed by him and is prejudicial to the prosecution.

## 2.3 Functions, Powers And Duties Of Prosecutors

### 2.3.1 Prosecutor General

Administration of the Prosecution Service vests with the Prosecutor General. He may delegate any of his powers to an Additional Prosecutor General or Deputy Prosecutor General. He is invested with power to issue guidelines to Prosecutors and Investigating Officers of Police for better and efficient prosecution of criminal cases. The Prosecutor General shall submit an Annual Report of the Service and keep the Government informed about the performance of the Service.

### 2.3.3 Additional Prosecutor Generals & Deputy Prosecutor Generals

Additional Prosecutor Generals and Deputy Prosecutor Generals conduct prosecution before superior courts i.e. Supreme Court of Pakistan, Federal Shariat Court of Pakistan and Lahore High Court, Lahore. In addition to this they are obliged to execute any of the power delegated to them by the Prosecutor General, Punjab. They are also supervising prosecutorial work as Incharge Regional offices of Prosecutor General Punjab at the Supreme Court of Pakistan, Federal Shariat Court of Pakistan and Lahore High Court, Lahore and its benches.

### 2.3.4 District Public Prosecutors

The District Public Prosecutor is an administrative head of the Prosecution Service at district level. The important function of a

District Public Prosecutor is to distribute prosecutorial work to his subordinate Prosecutors working in Sessions and Magisterial Courts. He also supervises prosecutorial work of his subordinate Prosecutors and exercises authority of administrative and financial functions of district prosecution office.

### **2.3.5 Deputy District Public Prosecutors & Assistant District Public Prosecutors**

The duty of Deputy District Public Prosecutor and Assistant District Public Prosecutor working in districts is to tender advice and guidance to Police during course of investigation for the purpose collecting available evidence and to scrutinize the Police Reports of their concerned police stations. Moreover, their duty is to conduct prosecution of criminal cases at Sessions and Magisterial Courts as and when deputed. Feeling aggrieved of any order/judgment by any Sessions or Magisterial Courts prepare appeals, Revisions, cancellations of bails and any other order as recommended by the District Appeal Committee.

#### ***2.3.5.1 District Appeal Committees***

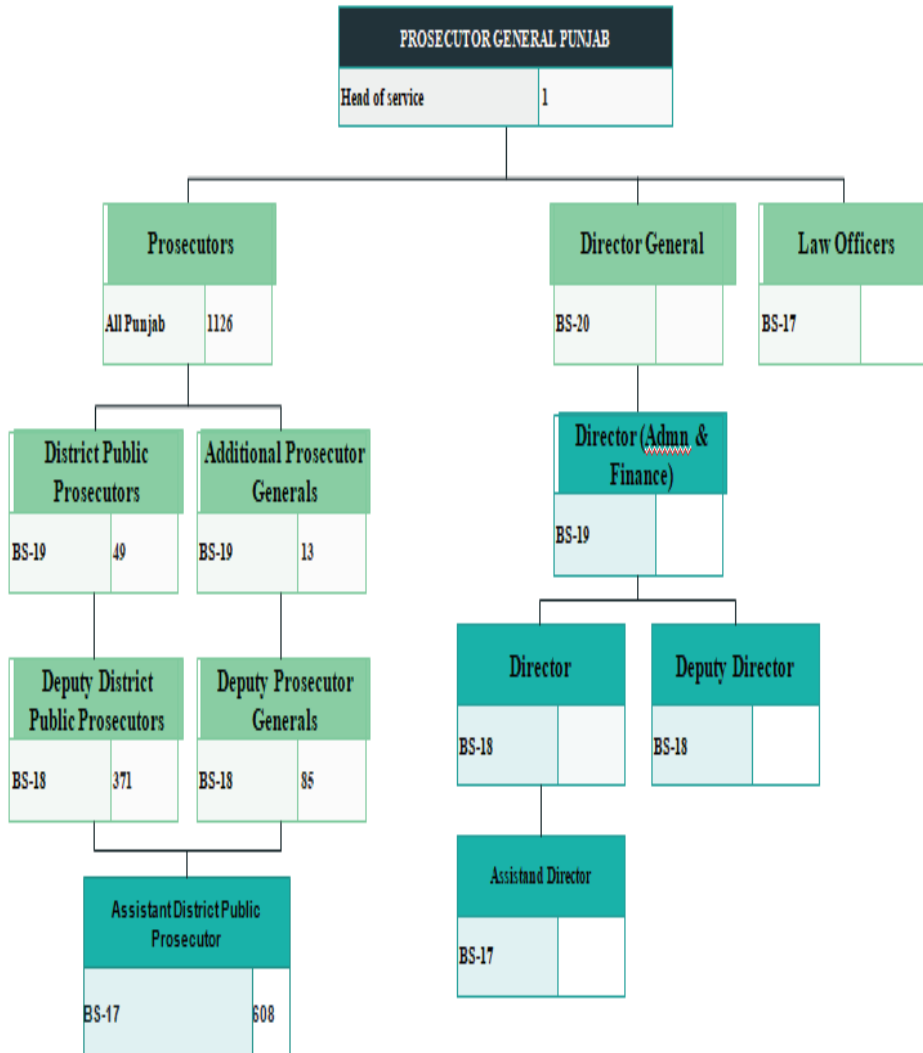
In all the Districts, an appeal committee has been established in the office of the District Public Prosecutors, which evaluates the cases decided as to whether any judgment or order needs to be impugned or not. If committee recommends that order/judgment may be assailed, then the case is forwarded to the concerned regional offices of the Prosecutor General Punjab. The Regional office after getting necessary opinion and sanction proceed accordingly.

#### ***2.3.5.2 District challan scrutiny committee***

There is also District Challan Scrutiny Committee in each district which supervises the scrutiny process by the Prosecutors and recommends or advices parameters to check the report.

### **3 PROSECUTORIAL PERFORMANCE**

#### **3.1 Prosecution of Cases –**

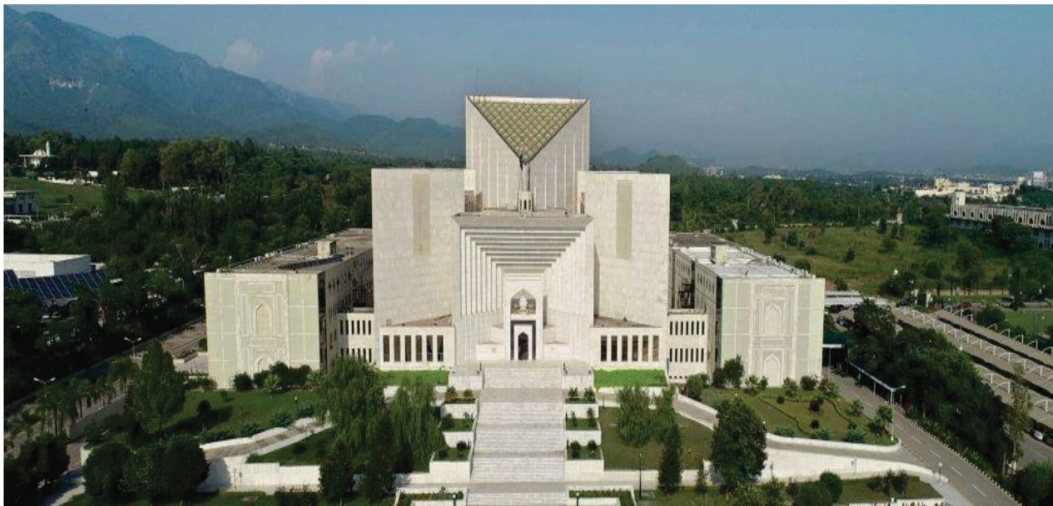
A performance review According to the common perception, the rate of conviction is generally considered a crucial criterion for evaluating performance of prosecutors in criminal cases. The successful prosecution, however, should not be assessed merely by rate of conviction of the criminal cases. Effective prosecution implies victory of justice, fairness and equity. Several factors contribute to the dispensation of wholesome justice in the criminal justice system such as neutral, objective and thorough investigation by professionally mature, well-trained and impartial police investigators, quick, independent and fair trial strict adherence to the best practices and standards of due process of law are another unique feature of efficient Prosecution. Effective prosecution is an integral part of a successful criminal justice system. A statistical synopsis of the actually contested cases by the parties and decided at all levels of the Judicial hierarchy mentioned below will show the analytic picture of the prosecutorial performance.

1. Supreme Court of Pakistan
2. Federal Shariat Court
3. Lahore High Court
4. Special Courts Anti-Terrorism
5. Special Courts Anti-Corruption

6. Drug Courts, Punjab
7. Punjab Environmental Tribunal, Lahore

### 3.1.1 Supreme Court of Pakistan



The Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service (PCPS) is committed to adhere standardized prosecutorial services before the Final Appellate Court of Pakistan; Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan at Principal Seat Islamabad and Lahore Registry. PCPS has extended an independent, fair, and effective prosecution in 2019 and opted the International prosecution norms in assisting the court in deciding the cases. Success rate at Supreme Court is 74.27%

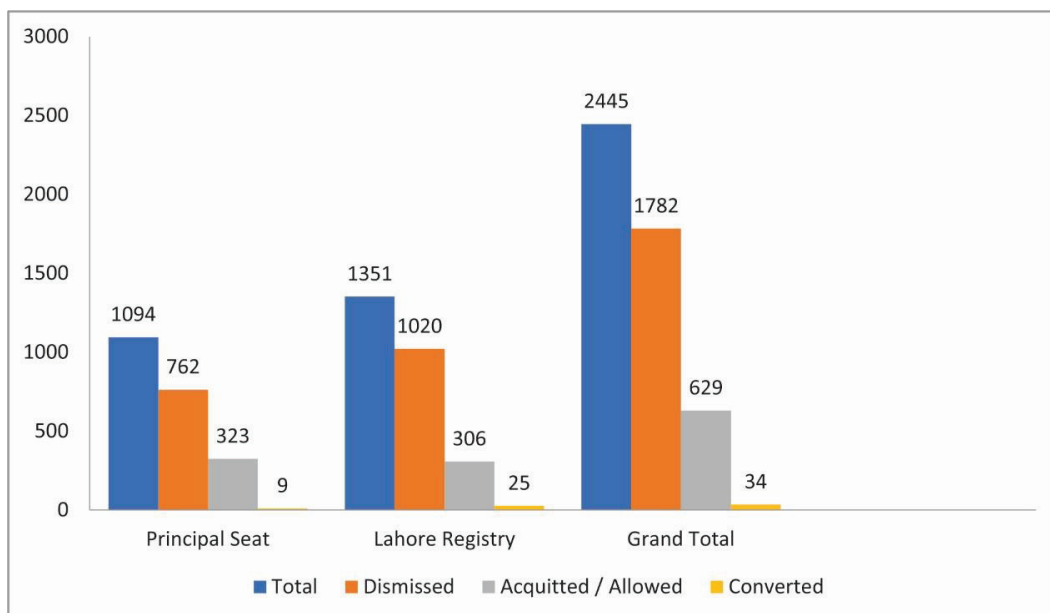

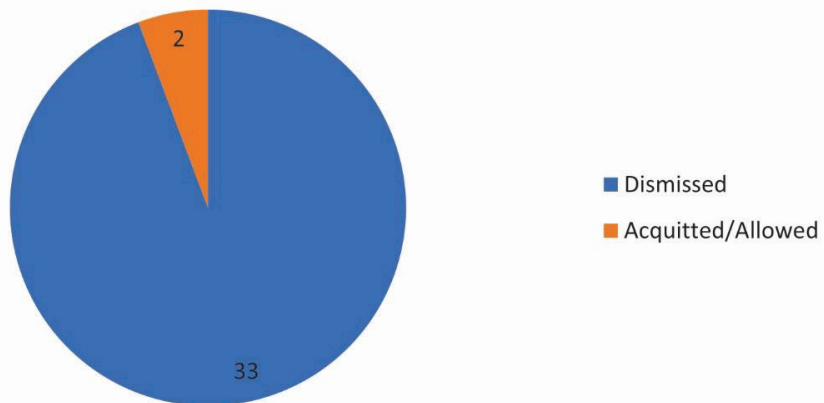

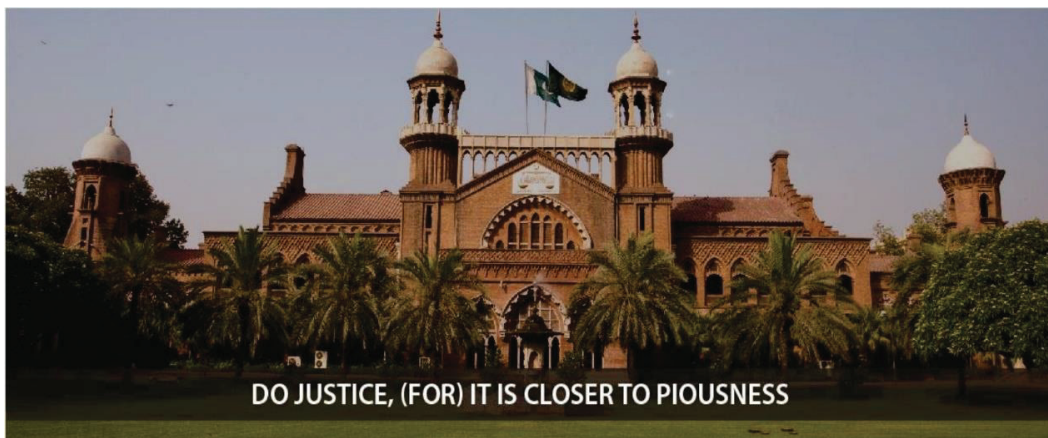

### 3.1.3 Lahore High Court, Lahore



Lahore High Court has Appellate jurisdiction across the Punjab. PCPS strived in adhering to its effective, fair and independent prosecution service while conducting prosecutions, before the Hon'ble Lahore High Court, and its Hon'ble benches. In 2019, PCPS's prosecutors furnished their prosecutorial responsibilities in deciding 29675 cases by Hon'ble Lahore High Court Lahore; including benches at Bahawalpur, Multan and Rawalpindi. Collectively PCPS's success rate remained 56.41% as a whole.

## 5 ENSURING BRILLIANCE

The Service keeps up standards both through bridles of internal discipline and external assessment carried out by the Inspectorate Service. Any defiance with directions, central guidelines, rules, principles, requires thorough examination of complaints and the litigating of appeals/revisions against court decisions.

Relying upon the reports of the Inspectorate Service, counteractive proceedings are also exacted by the Prosecution Department

The Monitoring Service independently furnishes its yearly performance report which gives an autonomous perspective of compliance with prosecutorial standards. The two reports ought to accordingly be perused together.

### 5.1 Guidelines So Far Issued:

To ensure efficiency and brilliance in the service the prosecutor general issues guidelines from time to time some important guidelines are mentioned in the following;

- i. Action Against Delinquent Police Officials,
- ii. Instructions regarding cases of juvenile accused,
- iii. Scrutiny of reports u/s 173 Cr.P.C.,
- iv. Mechanism of Submission of Challan,
- v. Guidelines for prosecutorial decision making when the case is not fit for trial due to deficient evidence or other reasons,
- vi. Withdrawal of cases,
- vii. Liaison with police and prosecution,
- viii. Guidelines for cases of abduction or killing of human right defenders,
- ix. Guidelines for PFSA

## 5.2 Issuance Of Appeal Policy And Formation Of Different Committees:

Office of prosecutor General Punjab issued guidelines for prosecutors and Appeals Committees or the concerned Authorities in form of handbook and the other relevant instructions issued from time to time by the Competent Authority and a strict adherence to all the instructions and guidelines be ensured in letter and spirit and without fail. The concerned prosecutor is required to apply for the certified copies of the judgments/orders on the same day i.e the day on which an order or judgment is passed. He is further required under the guidance to act as under:-

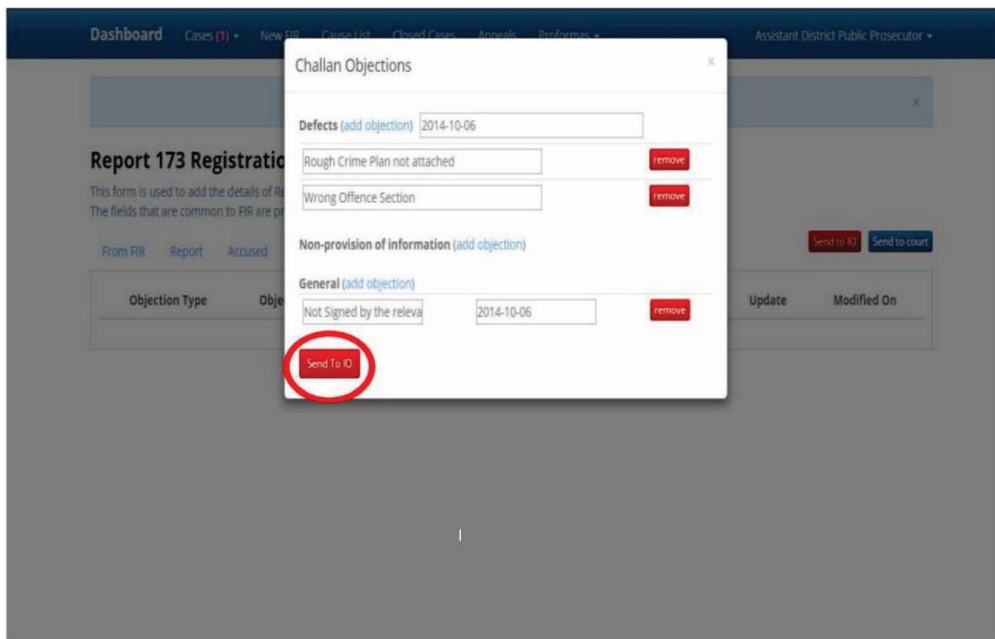

If you have any objection regarding investigating officer, go to ‘Send to IO’ written at the top and by clicking on this you will be able to enter objections which can be shown in the ‘Objections’ tab once you assign a resolution date to those objections. Press ‘Send to IO’ after entering objection



Once the objections are raised you can do three things

- i) Resolve (If the objection is resolved in given time)
- ii) Ignore (If the objection cannot be resolved at all)
- iii) Give a new date to resolve the objection (If the objection needs more time than allotted)

#### 5.4 Witnesses Protection Program

Witness related issues Resiling of witnesses is on rise due to lack of coordination between Police and Prosecutors. Although Witness protection act was introduced in year 2018 and first meeting of witness protection board was

held on 7.10.2019 and afterword this prosecutors were nominated as risk assessment officer in district and special courts and department has designed training program for the Prosecutors under this act.

## **6 STUMBLING BLOCK**

Prosecution is an integral part of the criminal justice system. It is the duty of the prosecutors to prove the accused guilty in courts. The police carry out the required investigation and submit challans against the accused and leave it to the prosecutors to fight the legal battle in courts.

The courts cannot award punishment on their own to anyone unless their crime is proven by facts and witnesses according to the Law of Evidence (Qanoon-e-Shahadat). So, in criminal cases, this task is performed by the prosecutors who try to prove the allegations against the accused in the light of the investigation done by the police and with the help of circumstantial as well as ocular evidence managed mostly by the police.

In Pakistan, the prosecution services used to be part of the police until 2002 and each province had its own prosecution wing, comprising of law graduates of the rank of sub-inspector, inspector or deputy superintendent. Under the Police Order 2002, these services were separated from the police and brought under the respective law departments of the provinces. Within the next few years, all the four provinces including Punjab had passed their Criminal Prosecution Service Act(s). Since then the situation is improving, though slowly, and that the prosecutors have started playing their due role from the very day of filing of the FIR. As earlier said that Prosecution plays an

important role in the administration of criminal justice System. Without successful prosecution, the desired objects cannot be yielded. The role of prosecutors not only commences soon after registration of a case, but it also lasts up to the final verdicts delivered by the criminal court. However there are some challenges and defiances which are creating hurdles in the performance of prosecutors. These hurdles are as follows.

### **6.1 Remuneration, Perks And Privileges.**

In comparison to other stakeholders of criminal justice system like Police and Judiciary, the salaries of prosecutors and staff are very low. In the days of high inflation, financial pressures upon the officers and officials hamper smooth running of the official work. Efforts are underway to address the issue which needs a wider support from different quarters.

### **6.2 Provision Of Infrastructural Facilities**

Provision of infrastructural facilities to the prosecutors Prosecution Service considers provision of the best facilities and an attractive working environment to the Prosecutors is an essential part of its future vision. Prosecutors and their staff are performing their duties in awfully non congenial working conditions of their offices. It should be a top priority area to be addressed urgently. A need assessment survey is being conducted this year for additional allocation in the next financial year to meet the basic infrastructural needs of the Prosecutors.

### **6.3 Police Prosecution Cooperation**

The lack of coordination police-prosecutor, and sometimes their mutual

connivance, is considered the main reason for low conviction rates in Pakistan. Cooperation between the police and the prosecution is necessary in bringing criminals to justice. This aspect needs both clear cut procedural clarity in creating a relation based on partnership and issues of capacity building and individual initiative at the lowest level. The efforts are reflected in four Police – Prosecutor Conferences at the highest level of both Services during the year that has a trickling effect but is still a far cry due to slow pace of change process. The Department intends to regularize these relations by setting common Standard Operating Procedures for both Police and Prosecutors.

#### **6.4 Defective Process Serving**

This issue is also playing role in weak administration of criminal justice system. There is need to effectively addresses the process serving in criminal cases.

#### **6.5 Home District Policy**

Policy regarding restrictions of posting at the district of domicile has adversely influenced the efficiency of our prosecutors, as there are limited Government Residences and most of the time they are already occupied. Hence, the prosecutors are left with no other option than, either to arrange private residences at a rent much higher than the actual House Rent Allowance they are being paid with, or they have to travel long across the districts to perform their duties and back to their homes, resulting in undue financial burden and physical as well as mental fatigue. Late coming, early going and sometimes absence are also the offshoots of this strict arbitrary policy.

Moreover, due to postings in districts other than their home domicile district, the prosecutors more often have to face undue pressure, harassment and intimidation by the local bar members.

#### **6.6 Increased Reliance On Scientific And Forensic Mode Of Evidence**

The weakness of direct mode of evidence widely in vogue in local criminal justice system has crippling effect on achieving the ends of justice. This aspect is sharply creating a trust deficit in the public at large. The Government of Punjab's state of art project of Forensic Science Lab., is a ray of hope for the future of effective criminal administration of justice and the Department keeps a keen interest in benefiting from the facility by both properly advising police to effectively utilize the facility during investigation as well as relying on this mode in Court proceedings. Once it is ready and operational, the Department will get the Prosecutors trained from the Experts of the FSL.

#### **6.7 Witness Related Issues**

Resiling of witnesses is on rise due to lack of coordination between Police and Prosecutors. This is one of the capacity building issues in designing future training program for the Prosecutors to deal with witness handling.

#### **6.8 Performance Evaluation Mechanism**

Being a new set up Prosecution Service is lacking basic performance evaluation indicators. This aspect will be seriously perused during the coming year i.e. 2011. The department plans to develop job description and key performance indicators for Prosecutors of all categories along with setting Standard practicing procedures in and outside Courts and record keeping for case proceedings.
