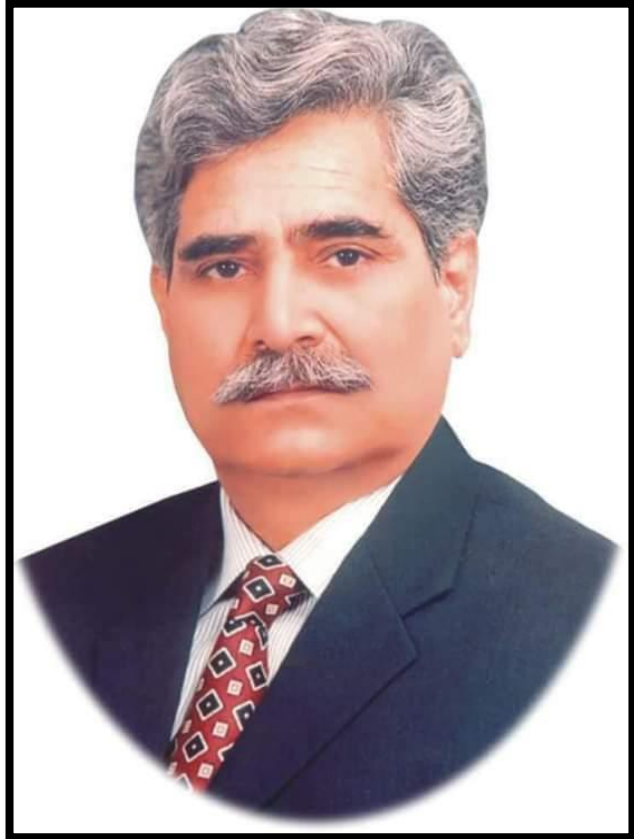

# **1 THE ORGANIZATION**

## **1.1 Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service**

Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service was founded in 2006 through the Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service (Constitution, Functions and Powers) Act, 2006. The Punjab Government Rules of Business 1974 were amended, whereby the function of Public Prosecution was excluded from the Home Department and entrusted to an independent Public Prosecution Department (PPD).

### **1.1.1 Slogan:**

“Quest For Justice.”

### **1.1.2 Vision:**

“No innocent shall be persecuted but no culprit shall go scot-free”

### **1.1.3 Mission:**

Its purpose was to establish an independent, effective and efficient Service for prosecution of criminal cases, to ensure prosecutorial independence and for better coordination in Criminal Justice System of the Province.

### **1.1.4 Values:**

The core value of the functionaries of Prosecution Service is that they accomplish their responsibility with utmost dedications and exercise their powers justly, fairly, honestly, with due diligence, in public interest and to make their supreme efforts for upholding justice. It is the primary duty of prosecutors to maintain honor and dignity of their profession.

### **1.1.5 Promoting Cooperation:**

All stake holders in Criminal Justice System need a humble approach in fair dealing of issues to lead the criminal processes in ease, and it is the quality that service maintains at all cost. A prosecutor is expected to be respectful to the courts, to the parties to the proceeding, opposing counsels and he shall never lose temper while performing his official duty. In order to ensure the fairness and effectiveness of prosecution, prosecutors’ cooperation with the Police, the Courts, the Legal Profession, Defense Counsels and other Government Agencies, and render assistance to the other prosecution services and

colleagues of other jurisdictions in accordance with law and in a spirit of mutual cooperation.

#### **1.1.6 Conduct in accordance with law:**

A prosecutor shall always conduct himself professionally in accordance with law, rules and precedents because laws and judicial precedents help the needy to seek justice from courts on approved terms; prosecutors being abreast of knowledge defy every effort to deviate from these standards.

#### **1.1.7 Assimilation of Executive Say:**

Government being a policy maker always needs supporters to formalize its vision for betterment of general public; prosecutors take this responsibility by putting it before the forums responsible for effective implementation.

#### **1.1.8 Check and Balance:**

Zero tolerance for corruption, fool-proof transparency and enviable degree of professional integrity are hallmarks of a modern prosecutorial system. Indeed, in our context, a paradigm shift is required in the age old and hardened mindset to achieve these values. This value steps into the service, to ensure the efficiency in performance of functions, preventing corruption and other vices, cleansing the miscellaneous and raising the level of service high.

### **1.2 Eyes in Focus:**

For achieving the objects of Prosecution Act i.e. independent, effective and efficient prosecution, there is need for amendments in Cr.P.C. although draft has already been shared with the interior ministry; hope doable be done soon. There is also need for developing SOPs for Medico-Legal officers and coordination among the stake holders to cover a large area of criminal litigation which has direct impact on socio economic activity of the country.

## **2 OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL PUNJAB:**

### **2.1 Functions**

Prosecutor General is the head of the Prosecution Service and administration of the Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service vests in the Prosecutor General. The

Additional Prosecutors General, Deputy Prosecutors General and Public Prosecutors in Special Courts are under direct supervision of the Prosecutor General whereas all the Prosecutors in the districts are under his general control. He distributes prosecutorial work to different Prosecutors in the Supreme Court, Federal Shariat Court, High Court and Special Courts of criminal jurisdiction (Anti-Terrorism Courts, Anti-Corruption Courts, Drug Courts, etc.). He has right of audience and representation on behalf of the Government in all the Courts of the country. He may delegate any of his powers to an Additional Prosecutor General or Deputy Prosecutor General. He is empowered to issue guidelines to Prosecutors and Investigation Officers of Police for better and efficient prosecution of criminal cases. He can recommend initiation of disciplinary proceedings against any public servant connected with investigation or prosecution of criminal cases for defective investigation or prosecution. He is competent to withdraw from prosecution of any person either generally or in respect of any one or more offences for which he is being tried where the offences punishable up to seven years and stop prosecution in any case on behalf of the Government. The Prosecutor General shall submit an Annual Report of the Service and keep the Government informed about the performance of the Service.

### 2.3.3 Additional Prosecutors General & Deputy Prosecutors General

Additional Prosecutors General and Deputy Prosecutors General conduct prosecution before superior courts i.e. Supreme Court of Pakistan, Federal Shariat Court of Pakistan and Lahore High Court, Lahore. They are also responsible to perform any of the delegated powers of the Prosecutor General. They are also supervising prosecutorial work as

Incharge Regional offices of Prosecutor General and Appeal Committees.

#### **2.3.4 District Public Prosecutors**

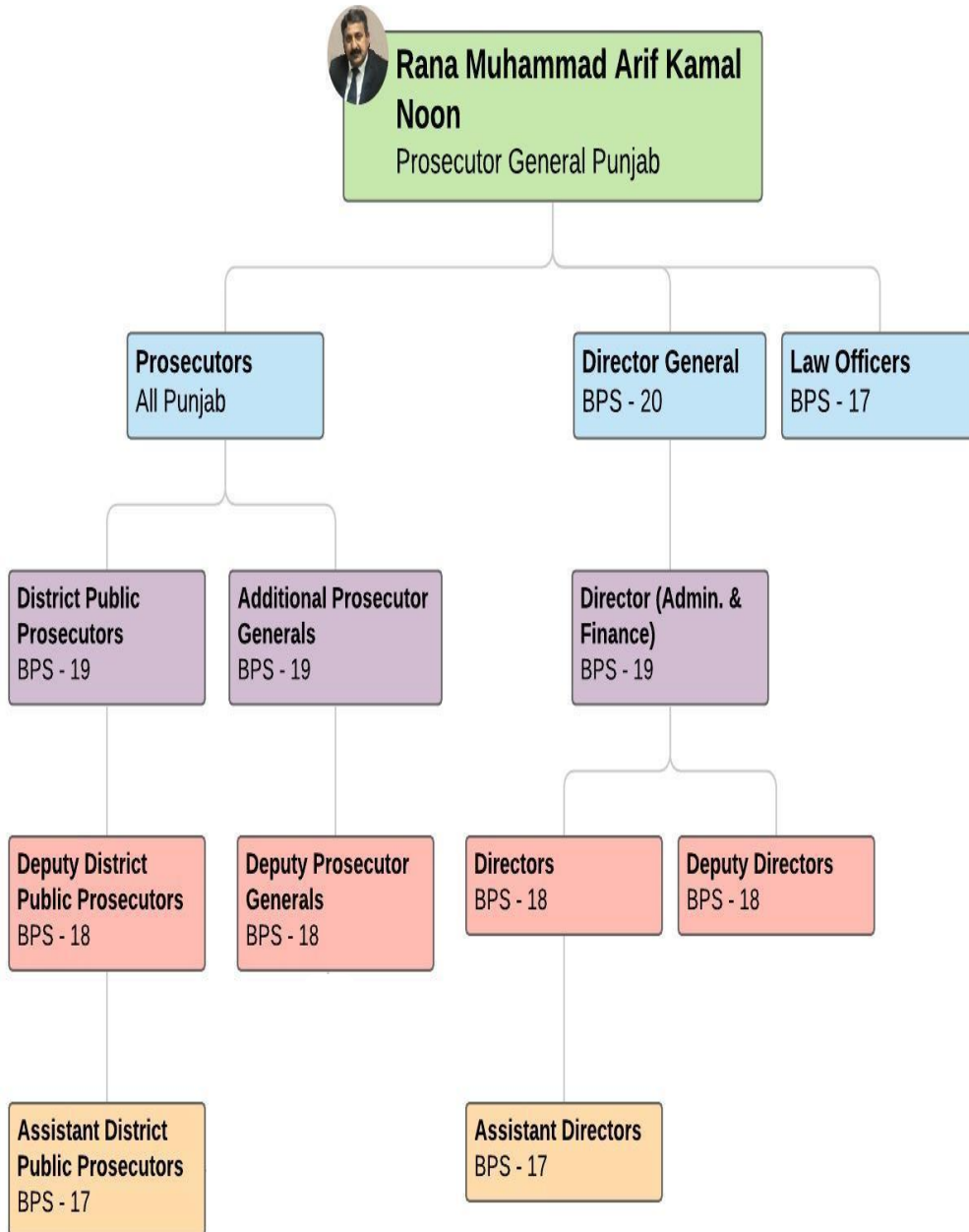
The District Public Prosecutor is an Administrative Head of the Prosecution Service at District Level. The important function of a District Public Prosecutor is to distribute prosecutorial work to his subordinate Prosecutors working in Courts of Session and Courts of Magistrates. He also supervises prosecutorial work of his subordinate Prosecutors and exercises authority of administrative and financial functions of District Prosecution Office.

#### **2.3.5 Deputy District Public Prosecutors & Assistant District Public Prosecutors**

The duty of Deputy District Public Prosecutor and Assistant District Public Prosecutor working in districts is to tender advice and guidance to Police during course of investigation for the purpose collecting available evidence and to scrutinize the Police Reports of their concerned police stations. Moreover, their duty is to conduct prosecution of criminal cases at Courts of Session and Courts of Magistrates as and when deputed. Feeling aggrieved of any Order/Judgment by any Courts of Session or Courts of Magistrates prepare Appeals, Revisions, Cancellation of Bails and any other Order/Judgment as recommended by the District Appeal Committee.

### **3 PROSECUTORIAL PERFORMANCE**

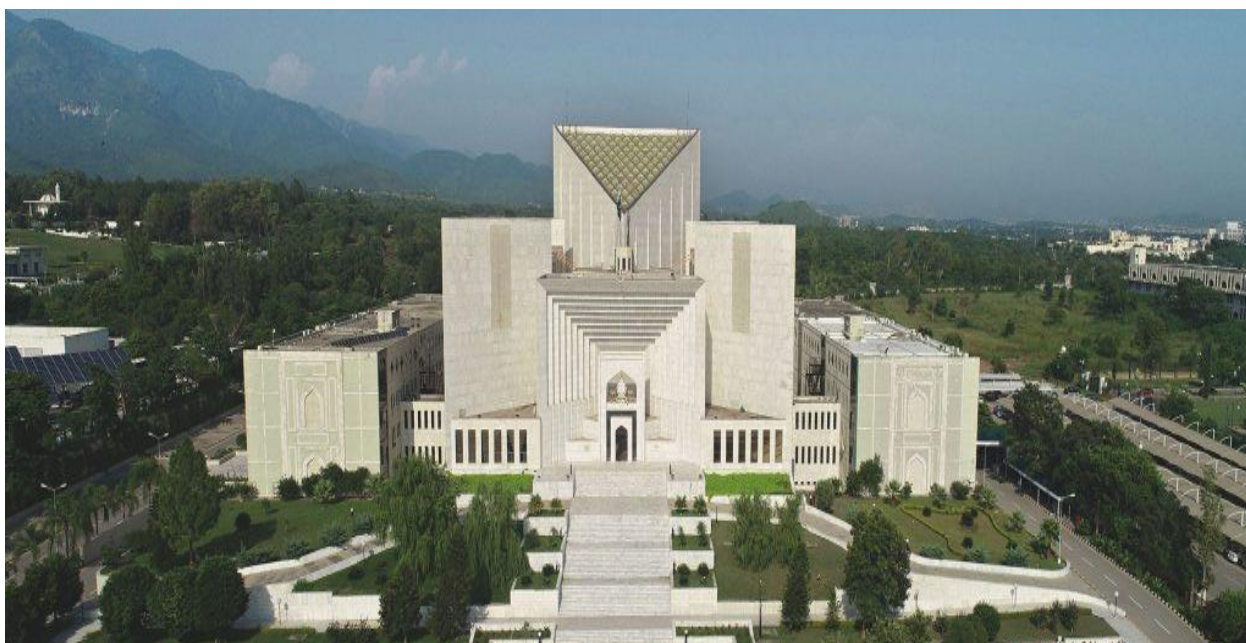
#### **3.1 Prosecution of Cases**

Main objective of the criminal trial is to determine whether an accused person has violated the penal law and where found guilty, to prescribe the appropriate sentence. Prosecution is an executive function of the state and is usually discharged through the institution of the prosecution. Rate of conviction is generally considered a criterion for evaluating performance of prosecutors in criminal cases. The successful prosecution, however, should not be assessed merely by rate of conviction of the criminal cases; it is not the mandate of the prosecutor to secure conviction at any cost. He is required to be fair, impartial and must present all the facts, including facts and circumstances favorable to the offender, before the court for an appropriate decision. Effective prosecution implies victory of justice, fairness and equity. Several factors contribute to the dispensation of wholesome justice in the Criminal Justice System such as neutrality; objectivity and thorough investigation by professionally mature, well-trained and impartial police investigators, quick, independent and fair trial, strict adherence to the best practices and standards of due process of law, are another unique feature of efficient Prosecution. Effective prosecution is an integral part of a successful Criminal Justice System. The Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service is successfully representing the state before the following forums;

### 3.1.1 Prosecutorial Work before Supreme Court of Pakistan



The Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service (PCPS) is committed to adhere standardized prosecutorial services before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan at Principal Seat Islamabad and Lahore Registry. PCPS has extended an independent, fair, and effective prosecution in 2020 and opted the International prosecution norms in assisting the court in deciding the cases. Overall disposal of work by appellate prosecutors, in Supreme Court of Pakistan is encouraging as there is increase in percentage of successful disposal of work with a success rate at 77.33%

#### 4. CAPACITY BUILDING ACTIVITY

Capacity building is valuable and important because of its long-term impacts. Under the supervision of the Public Prosecution Department, training and capacity-building programs are aimed at improving the ability of prosecutors to conduct effective prosecution. Change is required simultaneously in the following processes: educational content, cognitive, emotional, psychological, and organizational processes, and to achieve this goal, the Office of the Prosecutor General, Punjab, with collaboration of UNODC, NACTA, Punjab Judicial Academy, and other Lawyer Forums, has taken significant initiatives and made substantial efforts during the year 2020 to optimize the capacity building of prosecutors. Trainings were conducted on following important topics including;

1. Countering Financial Terrorism.
2. Mutual Legal Assistance in Terrorism Cases.
3. Combating Cyber Crimes.
4. Awareness on the Necessity of Paralegal Services for Vulnerable Segments of the Society.
5. Child Rights.

## 5 Mechanism of Monitoring

The Service keeps up standards both through bridles of internal discipline and external assessment carried out by the Inspectorate Service as well as monitoring section of Prosecutor General Punjab office. A strict and target-oriented mechanism of monitoring is in place to ensure that a flawless and speedy prosecution is conducted through all the phases of a trial. The Inspectorate independently furnishes its yearly performance report which gives an autonomous perspective of compliance with prosecutorial standards.

### 5.1 Guidelines So Far Issued

Prosecutor General issues guidelines from time to time to ensure efficiency and brilliance in the service. It is obligatory on the part of a prosecutor to follow the guidelines issued by the Prosecutor General, in public interest and keep himself well informed and abreast of relevant legal developments. Some important guidelines issued by the Prosecutor General Punjab are mentioned here;

- Guidelines for scrutiny of reports u/s 173 Cr.P.C.,
- Guidelines for scrutiny of Anti-Terrorism cases,
- Guidelines for internal monitoring system,
- Guidelines for prosecutorial decision making,
- Liaison with police and prosecution,
- Action against delinquent police officials,

### 5.2 Issuance of Appeal Policy and Formation of Different Committees

In a case where an accused person is acquitted or where less punishment is awarded to the accused or bail granted to an accused is against law, Prosecutor will recommend the filing of Appeal, Revision, or Cancellation of Bail, by forwarding the attested copy of the Order/Judgment along with grounds for such Appeal, Revision or Cancellation of Bail and other relevant documents to the District Public Prosecutor. Office of Prosecutor General Punjab issued guidelines for prosecutors and Appeal Committees and/or the concerned Authorities in form of a handbook and other relevant instructions.

### **5.3 Case Flow Management System of Prosecution**

Case Flow Management System of Prosecution Service has been integrated with police and a test drive is being launched for its effective operationalization and now Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service desires to integrate this system with Lahore High Court in future.

### **5.4 Witnesses Protection Program**

Witness related issues specially resiling of witnesses is one of the key problems. The Witness protection act was introduced in year 2018, first meeting of witness protection board was held on 7.10.2019 and thereafter Prosecutors were nominated as risk assessment officer in Districts and Special Courts. Department has also designed training programs for the Prosecutors under this Act.

### **5.5 Formulation of New Sections**

Prosecutor General Punjab has formulated Complaint Section to meet the vision of Punjab Government and the Hon'ble Prime Minister of Pakistan regarding transparent and corruption free Pakistan and for immediate response against any complaint received.

The **Generalized System of Preferences**, or **GSP**, is a preferential tariff system which provides tariff reduction on various products. To seek further extension in the GSP Plus status Pakistan has to implement certain conditions imposed by the EU. and to ensure the proper implementation of conditions regarding Criminal Justice System the Prosecutor General Punjab has established a new section "GSP-Plus Implementation Section."

### **5.6 Digitizing Monitoring Section of Prosecutor General Office**

Government of the Punjab has a vision of promoting digitization, transparency, good governance. As a part of "Government Systems Digitization", Government has streamlined various processes to develop citizen excellence, service delivery and efficient backend systems. Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service with help of PITB has decided to digitize Monitoring Section of Prosecutor General Office to ensure transparency and good governance.

### **5.7 Establishment of Library and Research Section**

Library reflects the diversity and character, and the needs and expectations of our Criminal Justice System. Those needs and expectations are often extensive, and the services invaluable so, Prosecutor General Punjab established a library in the office and also created a research center for the quick response towards queries from Appellate Courts as well as from District Courts.

### **5.8 Surprise Visits and Inspections**

During the year 2020 the Prosecutor General Punjab made the surprise visits in Districts as well as Regional Offices and Special Courts. During visits Prosecutor General Punjab issued different instructions specially regarding Legal Assistance to the I.Os, arrangements of investigation files, timely submission of Report u/s 173 Cr. P.C in the courts, fully preparation & maintaining of the Prosecution Files, filing of Appeals, pay more attention to work of District Scrutiny Committee, District Appeal Committee & Internal Monitoring Cell and submission of progress report of high profile cases to the office of Prosecutor General Punjab regularly.

## **6 Limitations**

Punjab Criminal Prosecution Service Act, 2006 is an important milestone towards realization of the dream of prosecutorial independence. Nevertheless, the situation on ground leaves much to be desired as the basic legal structure governing the Criminal Justice System is not robust enough for a Prosecutor's role to effectively handle the current Criminal Justice Processes. In the historical perspective, it is quite understandable that the imperial legislation (Criminal Procedure Code) was not imagined to be really compatible with the contemporary realities/aspirations, as for the colonial vested interest, it was hard to afford fair and uninfluenced prosecution due to its extraneous considerations. Surely the stately enactments could not possibly be aligned with public demands for fair and transparent adjudication at that time. These may be the reasons that the Code of Criminal Procedure enacted in 1898 did not contemplate introduction of independent and autonomous prosecution agency. Prosecution is an integral part of the Criminal Justice System. The role of prosecutors not only commences soon after registration of a case, but it also lasts up to the final verdicts delivered by the criminal

court. However, there are some challenges which are creating hurdles in the performance of prosecutors. These hurdles are as follows.

### **6.1 Remunerations, Perks and Privileges.**

A major administrative limitation is the low salary package of the employees of the Service. In comparison to other stakeholders of Criminal Justice System like Police and Judiciary, the salaries of Prosecutors and Staff are very low. In these days of high inflation, financial pressures upon the officers and officials hamper smooth running of the official work. Efforts are underway to address the issue which needs a wider support from different quarters.

### **6.2 Provision of Infrastructural Facilities**

There is a serious need to upgrade and improve the existing infrastructural facilities by providing adequate transport, suitable office space, furniture and other working tools to the Prosecutors. Lack of infrastructure and absence of reasonable working conditions for the officers and officials of the Service are adversely affecting their performance. Provision of infrastructural facilities and an attractive working environment to the Prosecutors is an essential part of its future vision.

### **6.3 Police Prosecution Cooperation**

The lack of Police Prosecution coordination is considered the main reason for low conviction rates in Pakistan. Cooperation between the police and the prosecution is necessary in bringing criminals to justice. This aspect needs both clear cut procedural clarity in creating a relation based on partnership and issues of Capacity Building and Individual Initiative at the lowest level. The efforts are reflected in four Police – Prosecutor Conferences, at the highest level of both Services during the year that has a trickling down effect but is still a far cry due to slow pace of change process. The Department intends to regularize these relations by setting Common Standard Operating Procedures for both Police and Prosecutors.

#### **6.4 Defective Process Serving**

Increasing litigation in the society and rising graph of crimes, it is essential that the courts should make an effort as the pre-trial hearing to dismiss/reject false, fictitious and frivolous claims but poor process serving is one of main hurdle and is also playing role in weak administration of Criminal Justice System. There is need to effectively addresses the process serving in criminal cases.

#### **6.5 Increased Reliance on Scientific and Forensic Mode of Evidence**

The weakness of Direct Mode of Evidence widely in vogue in Local Criminal Justice System has crippling effect on achieving the ends of justice. In year 2020 a large number of cases were acquitted due to judgment of SC cited as 2018 SCMR 2039 (Imam Bakhsh Case) and 2019 SCMR 930 (Khair-ul-Bashar Case) on the issue of protocol however, after meeting with authorities of Punjab Forensic Science Agency this problem was resolved. The Punjab Government's State of the Art Project of Forensic Science Lab. is a ray of hope for the future of effective administration of criminal justice and the Department takes a keen interest in benefiting from the facility, both by properly advising police to effectively utilize the facility during investigation and by relying on this mode in Court proceedings.
